

## Overview of the Old Testament

(\*the “critical list” of 13 books)

---

### 5 BOOKS of MOSES or THE PENTATEUCH (Greek: “five scrolls”)

- \***Genesis** “Origin(s)” Creation to Joseph’s death (2000 years).  
Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph
- \***Exodus** “Departure” The story of Moses’ Journey to Sinai and the  
10 Commandments; ends with God’s filling the tabernacle
- Leviticus** “Book of the Levi priests” Both ceremonial and moral laws.  
Very little historical account.
- \***Numbers** 2 numerical listings. Sinai to Jericho. Murmuring in the wilderness; spies  
on Canaan; Aaron’s rod; Moses’ sin; Balaam
- \***Deuteronomy** (“Second Law”) God’s love; 10 Commandments repeated;  
details on the Law; mostly addresses by Moses; Moses’ death.

### 12 BOOKS of HISTORY or THE FORMER PROPHETS

- \***Joshua** Joshua is Moses’ successor. Entering the Promised Land; conquest of  
Canaan; land allotment of the 12 tribes of Israel; Joshua’s death
- Judges** c. 400 yrs. of apostasy and revival. Joshua’s death to the start of the kings.  
13 judges of Israel, including Deborah, Gideon and Samson
- Ruth** A picture of hope during the dark time of the Judges. Ruth’s husband,  
Boaz, is David’s great grandfather.
- \***1 Samuel** The life of Samuel, Saul and David until the death of Saul. Goliath.  
Originally called “1 Kings” after Saul, Israel’s 1<sup>st</sup> king
- \***2 Samuel** David’s kingship. Ark of the covenant; Bathsheba.  
Originally called “2 Kings” after David, Israel’s 2<sup>nd</sup> king
- 1 Kings** Solomon and the division of the kingdom. Additional kings. Elijah.  
Originally called “3 Kings” after Solomon, Israel’s 3<sup>rd</sup> king
- 2 Kings** Rehoboam & more kings. Elisha. The destruction of Israel (to Assyria)  
The destruction of Judah (to Babylon); Originally called “4<sup>th</sup> Kings”
- 1&2 Chronicles** Genealogies. Overview of OT history with much repetition. The temple of  
God is the key theme. 2 Chronicles starts w/Solomon.
- Ezra** Revival in Babylon under Cyrus. A remnant returns to Jerusalem. The  
rebuilding of the temple under Zerubbabel & prophet Ezra.
- Nehemiah** The rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem under Nehemiah.  
The final historical record of the Old Testament.
- Esther** God’s working on behalf of the Jewish people. Jewish Esther becomes  
Queen of Xerxes and protects her people from destruction.

### 5 BOOKS of POETRY or WISDOM LITERATURE

- Job** Why do bad things happen to good people? The mystery of suffering  
Possibly the oldest book in the world. Setting: pre-Moses.
- \***Psalms** The hymnbook of the Old Testament. Many Psalms by David.
- \***Proverbs** The wisdom of the Old Testament. Many proverbs by Solomon.
- Ecclesiastes** The meaninglessness of worldly attainment, as related by Solomon.  
Conclusion? – all is vanity; and fear God, for there is a judgement

**Song of Solomon** (or “Song of Songs”) Romantic love. A picture of Christ and the Church.

### **5 BOOKS of MAJOR PROPHETS (or LATTER PROPHETS)**

<b>*Isaiah</b>	The major book of Bible prophecy in the Old Testament There is much about the Christ in this important prophetic book.
<b>Jeremiah</b>	Warnings about sin and judgment. Promise of hope and restoration. Contains the clearest OT prophesy of the indwelling Holy Spirit.
<b>Lamentations</b>	A lament concerning the destruction of Jerusalem. 5 separate poems.
<b>Ezekiel</b>	A prophetic book which includes numerous references to the Millennial Kingdom. Ezekiel prophesies of the rebuilding of Jerusalem and Israel.
<b>*Daniel</b>	History and prophecy. Often studied together with Revelation. Includes stories of the fiery furnace, the lion’s den and handwriting on the wall.

### **12 BOOKS of MINOR PROPHETS (or LATTER PROPHETS)**

<b>Hosea</b>	Israel likened to Hosea's unfaithful wife. Hosea prophesied under king Jeroboam to the Northern kingdom (Israel).
<b>Joel</b>	Desolation (locust plague) and deliverance. Probably prophesied under king Joash to the Southern kingdom (Judah).
<b>Amos</b>	A word of warning to Israel (the northern kingdom). Amos was a contemporary of Hosea.
<b>Obadiah</b>	A prophecy against Edom (the descendants of Esau, Jacob's brother). Shortest book in the Bible.
<b>*Jonah</b>	The best known of the "Minor Prophets," “Running from God.” 2 Miracles: swallowed by the big fish and Ninevah’s repentance.
<b>Micah</b>	A word of prophecy to Judah (the southern kingdom). Micah was a contemporary of Isaiah. Micah prophesies of the advent of the Messiah.
<b>Nahum</b>	A prophecy of the fall of Nineveh.
<b>Habakkuk</b>	2 questions and 2 answers. Written in Hebrew lyric poetry.
<b>Zephaniah</b>	Prophecies of wrath and coming Millennial blessing. Prophesied during the reign of king Josiah.
<b>Haggai</b>	Setting priorities straight. A contemporary of Ezra and Zerubbabel, he urged the rebuilding of the temple in Jerusalem.
<b>Zechariah</b>	A major prophetic book, but one that is little studied. Strong emphasis on repentance. Includes many visions and Messianic prophesies.
<b>*Malachi</b>	Question and answer format. Attacks the degenerate priesthood and sins of the people after the exile. Prophesies of John the Baptist.
