

PROVERBS on YOU and YOUR DECISIONS

Prov. 3:5, 6 Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight.

Prov. 8:14 [God:] “Counsel is mine and sound wisdom; I am understanding, power is mine.”

Prov. 12:15 The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man is he who listens to counsel.

Prov. 13:10 Through presumption comes nothing but strife, but with those who receive counsel is wisdom.

Prov. 13:20 He who walks with wise men will be wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm.

Prov. 14:6-8 A scoffer seeks wisdom, and finds none, but knowledge is easy to him who has understanding. Leave the presence of a fool, or you will not discern words of knowledge. The wisdom of the prudent is to understand his way, but the folly of fools is deceit.

Prov. 14:12 There is a way which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death.

Prov. 14:15, 16 The naive believes everything, but the prudent man considers his steps. A wise man is cautious and turns away from evil, but a fool is arrogant and careless.

Prov. 14:18 The naive inherit folly, but the prudent are crowned with knowledge.

Prov. 15:22 Without consultation, plans are frustrated, but with many counselors they succeed.

Prov. 16:1-3 The plans of the heart belong to man, but the answer of the tongue is from the Lord. All the ways of a man are clean in his own sight, but the Lord weighs the motives.

Commit your works to the Lord, and your plans will be established.

Prov. 16:9 The mind of man plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps.

Prov. 16:33 The lot is cast into the lap, but its every decision is from the Lord.

Prov. 18:13 He who gives an answer before he hears it is folly and shame to him.

Prov. 18:17, 18 The first to plead his case seems just, until another comes and examines him. The lot puts an end to contentions, and decides between the mighty.

Prov. 19:2 Also it is not good for a person to be without knowledge, and he who makes haste with his feet errs.

Prov. 19:21 Many are the plans in a man's heart, but the counsel of the Lord, it will stand.

Prov. 19:25 Strike a scoffer and the naive may become shrewd, but reprove one who has understanding and he will gain knowledge.

Prov. 21:1, 2 The king's heart is like channels of water in the hand of the Lord; He turns it wherever He wishes. Every man's way is right in his own eyes, But the Lord weighs the hearts.

Prov. 21:5 The plans of the diligent lead surely to advantage, but everyone who is hasty comes surely to poverty.

Prov. 21:30, 31 There is no wisdom and no understanding and no counsel against the Lord. The horse is prepared for the day of battle, but victory belongs to the Lord.

Prov. 22:3 The prudent sees the evil and hides himself, but the naive go on, and are punished for it.

Prov. 24:5, 6 A wise man is strong, and a man of knowledge increases power. For by wise guidance you will wage war, and in abundance of counselors there is victory.

Prov. 25:2 It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, but the glory of kings is to search out a matter.

Prov. 27:1 Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth.

Prov. 28:26 He who trusts in his own heart is a fool, but he who walks wisely will be delivered.

Prov. 29:13 The poor man and the oppressor have this in common: The Lord gives light to the eyes of both.
