

## PROVERBS on YOU and YOUR HONESTY

Prov. 10:2 Ill-gotten gains do not profit, but righteousness delivers from death.

Prov. 11:1 A false balance is an abomination to the Lord, but a just weight is His delight.

Prov. 11:3 The integrity of the upright will guide them, but the falseness of the treacherous will destroy them.

Prov. 11:18 The wicked earns deceptive wages, but he who sows righteousness gets a true reward.

Prov. 12:12 The wicked desires the booty of evil men, But the root of the righteous yields fruit.

Prov. 12:17-19 He who speaks truth tells what is right, but a false witness, deceit. There is one who speaks rashly like the thrusts of a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Truthful lips will be established forever, but a lying tongue is only for a moment.

Prov. 12:22 Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, but those who deal faithfully are His delight.

Prov. 13:5, 6 A righteous man hates falsehood, but a wicked man acts disgustingly and shamefully. Righteousness guards the one whose way is blameless, but wickedness subverts the sinner.

Prov. 13:11 Wealth obtained by fraud dwindles, but the one who gathers by labor increases it.

Prov. 14:2 He who walks in his uprightness fears the Lord, but he who is crooked in his ways despises Him.

Prov. 14:25 A truthful witness saves lives, but he who speaks lies is treacherous.

Prov. 15:27 He who profits illicitly troubles his own house, but he who hates bribes will live.

Prov. 16:11 A just balance and scales belong to the Lord; all the weights of the bag are His concern.

Prov. 17:3 The refining pot is for silver and the furnace for gold, but the Lord tests hearts.

Prov. 19:5 A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who tells lies will not escape.

Prov. 19:9 A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who tells lies will perish.

Prov. 19:28 A rascally witness makes a mockery of justice, and the mouth of the wicked spreads iniquity.

Prov. 20:10 Differing weights and differing measures, both of them are abominable to the Lord.

Prov. 20:14 “Bad, bad,” says the buyer; but when he goes his way, then he boasts.

Prov. 20:17 Bread obtained by falsehood is sweet to a man, but afterward his mouth will be filled with gravel.

Prov. 20:23 Differing weights are an abomination to the Lord, and a false scale is not good.

Prov. 21:6 The getting of treasures by a lying tongue is a fleeting vapor, the pursuit of death.

Prov. 21:15 The execution of justice is joy for the righteous, but is terror to the workers of iniquity.

Prov. 21:28 A false witness will perish, but the man who listens to the truth will speak forever.

Prov. 23:15, 16 My son, if your heart is wise, my own heart also will be glad; and my inmost being will rejoice, when your lips speak what is right.

Prov. 24:23 These also are sayings of the wise. to show partiality in judgment is not good.

Prov. 28:4=9 Those who forsake the law praise the wicked, but those who keep the law strive with them. Evil men do not understand justice, but those who seek the Lord understand all things. Better is the poor who walks in his integrity, than he who is crooked though he be rich. He who keeps the law is a discerning son, but he who is a companion of gluttons humiliates his father. He who increases his wealth by interest and usury, gathers it for him who is gracious to the poor. He who turns away his ear from listening to the law, even his prayer is an abomination.

Prov. 28:21 To show partiality is not good, because for a piece of bread a man will transgress.

Prov. 29:18 Where there is no vision, the people are unrestrained, but happy is he who keeps the law.

Prov. 29:27 An unjust man is abominable to the righteous, and he who is upright in the way is abominable to the wicked.
